Residential Options of Florida is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that develops and operates affordable and accessible housing for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

Income-qualified adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities can apply to rent a single-occupancy bedroom in a ROOF home. Highly affordable, rent can be as low as \$235 per month for each resident in a ROOF home.

Living in a ROOF home creates the opportunity for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities to live in a fully-inclusive environment. ROOF residents exercise their independence by selecting the people or agencies that will provide support services (support coordinator, live-in caregiver, supported living coach, job coach, etc.) directly to them in their ROOF home.

ROOF owns a total of 6 homes in Southwest Florida: Collier County: 3 homes; Lee County: 2 homes, and Charlotte County: 1 home. In addition to a statewide Board of Directors, ROOF has active Boards of Trustees in six counties and is expanding across the state.
